My LORD DUKE,-

I have the honor to enclose a Memorial from the Legislative Council of this Colony to Her Journals of Legislative Majesty, praying that the number of Members of the Legislative Council should not exceed threefourths of the number of the Members of the House of Representatives for the time being; and that no greater number of new members be appointed, in any one year, to the Legislative Council in addition to those required to fill up vacancies by deaths, resignations, or other causes, than would amount to one-eighth of the entire number of members composing the said Council.

2. This Memorial having been referred to my Responsible Advisers, they have informed me that they have no observation to make upon it, from which I presume that they concur in its prayer,
