SESSION XVII., 1864.

EXTRACT FROM THE JOURNALS OF THE AUCKLAND PROVINCIAL COUNCIL, THURSDAY, NOVEMBER
16TH, 1864.

RESOLVED—

“That the Council recognises the claim of the Volunteer Militia Cavalry and Naval Forces, who have been engaged during the rebellion, to grants of land, not so much as payment for service, but more to substantially testify as an acknowledgment by the Government of the valuable and efficient aid rendered in time of need.”

“That the Council recommend for consideration by the General Government the foregoing resolution, with a view to some portion of the lands in the Waikato, about to be confiscated, being set apart for the above purpose.”

“That the Speaker be requested to forward the foregoing resolutions to the General Government.”
