Mr. Coates' Report.

SIR,—

Mining Survey Office, Clyde, 11th April, 1865.

In compliance with instructions contained in your circular letter (No. 1775, 1864), I have the honor to furnish you with the following Report relative to the progress and present condition of mining operations within this district.

In particularly describing the condition of mining operations, I find it necessary to refer severally to the workings of each Warden's District.

In the vicinity of the Dunstan the chief workings are those upon the Manor Burn Flat and at Sandy Point, the latter locality situate upon the western bank of the Clutha, between four and six (4 and 6) miles below the township of Clyde. Upon the Manor Burn Flat operations generally,
