Building materials are now to be purchased on reasonable terms. Under these circumstances, the Commissioners suggest, for the consideration of the Government, whether it is desirable that they should be prohibited from proceeding with the building, now that the contract may be secured on reasonable terms.

As they are acting in the execution of a Commission issued to them under the hand of the Governor, and under the public seal of the Colony, directing them to take the necessary steps for causing the construction, without delay, of a Government House, the Commissioners submit that they will hardly

be justified in staying their proceedings except by virtue of an equal formal authority.

I am directed to add, for the information of the Government, that as the business of the Commission did not appear to them to justify them in the employment of a paid Secretary at a salary of three hundred pounds a year, the Commissioners, after giving Mr. Kempthorne a month's notice, ceased to employ his services as Secretary, on the 1st instant.
