Secs. 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15. Imposing duties on Sheriff of convening meetings and conducting elections.	Objectionable, as imposing duties on officer of General Government not having any relation to Provincial Governments.
Sec. 23. Board to sue and be sued in name of Clerk. No action to abate by death of Commissioner (five being a Board).	<i>Ultra vires</i> , and matter sufficiently provided for by Acts of General Assembly.
Sec. 28. Power to Board to make by-laws, and provide therein for imposition of penalties.	<i>Ultra vires</i> , for though the Constitution Act forbids the altering of the criminal law by Provincial Councils, and although "The Provincial Council Powers Act, 1856," enables Provincial Legislatures to create offences and impose penalties up to £100, it does not enable such Legislature to give a similar power to other bodies.
Sec. 29. Power to Justice of the Peace before whom penalty is recovered to remit penalty.	Questionable.
Secs. 95, 96, 97, 98. Power to sell land for rates, and imposing duties on Justices to set out land to be sold, and to Sheriff to sign conveyance.	<i>Ultra vires</i> , and subject sufficiently provided for by "Sale for Non-payment of Rates Act, 1862."
Sec. 84. Power given to Resident Magistrate to order the forfeiture of unwholesome food.	<i>Ultra vires</i> .
Sec. 94. Power to Collector to recover rates.	Ditto. (<i>Bagge v. Sinclair</i> .)
Sec. 111. In default of owner doing work to his premises, Board may repair same, and expenses of repairing may be recovered by summary proceedings.	Unintelligible. It does not provide in what Court and in what way. So far as applicable to any Court other than Resident Magistrate's up to £20, is <i>ultra vires</i> .
<i>The Drainage Act, 1863.</i> No. 7, Sess. X.	
Subsec. 2 of Sec. 4. Affects to give powers to Supreme Court to direct how compensation money should be applied.	<i>Ultra vires</i> , as affecting jurisdiction of Supreme Court.
Sec. 6. Two Justices of the Peace, assembled on application of either party, may state compensation and decide disputes.	<i>Ultra vires</i> .
Sec. 9. Provides for settlement of disputes by arbitration, and making award a rule of Supreme Court.	Ditto.
Sec. 15. Empowers Justices of the Peace to decide questions as to what lands are benefited by drainage.	Ditto.
<i>The Public Boards Act, 1856.</i> No. 3, Sess. III. (Misprinted No. 2, Sess. III.)	
Secs. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13. Impose on Commissioners and Justices of the Peace duties of calling meetings of inhabitants, and holding elections of Boards.	Objectionable for reasons stated as regards similar provisions in other Acts.
Sec. 18. Contracts to be made in name of Chairman; action not to abate by death of member of Board.	<i>Ultra vires</i> . Alters practice of Court.
<i>An Act to amend and consolidate the Law relating to District Highways.</i> No. 10, Sess. IX.†	
<i>The District Highways Act, 1867.</i>	
Sec. 5. Speaks of Justices of a proclaimed district, and confers upon them the duties of calling meetings and holding elections.	<i>Ultra vires</i> . (<i>Bagge v. Sinclair</i> .)
