COPY of a DESPATCH from Governor the Most Hon. the Marquis of NORMANBY  
to the Right Hon. the Earl of CARNARVON.

Government House, Wellington,

MY LORD,—

New Zealand, 13th November, 1877.

I regret to say that a case has arisen which I am obliged to submit for  
your Lordship's decision.2. On the 26th October, Sir George Grey came to me and requested me, on  
the part of the Government, to appoint a Mr. Wilson to the Legislative Council.
