S.S. “HINEMOA”

(COST OF WORKING THE), ETC.

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives, dated the 2nd of August, 1878.

Ordered, “That a return be laid before this House showing the total cost of the working and maintenance of the Government steamer ‘Hinemoa,’ from the 1st of December, 1877, to the 30th of June, 1878; also a return of those persons’ other than His Excellency and Staff, and Ministers, who, during the aforesaid period, have travelled in the ‘Hinemoa,’ at the expense of the colony.”—(Mr. Fitzroy.)
