The Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor. (Circular.)

I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of a letter from the Admiralty, stating that the Lords Commissioners have had under their consideration the desirability of developing and increasing the efficiency of such Naval or Coast Defence Forces as may have been established in Her Majesty's Colonies for the protection of the ports, commerce, or coasts of those Colonies, and, with that object in view, suggesting the co-operation of Governors of Colonies with the several Naval Commanders-in-Chief in obtaining information of the nature indicated in their letter.

It will no doubt be an advantage to a Colony to receive from time to time an independent report on its defensive arrangements; and, if your Ministers concur in the suggestions of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, I shall be glad to be informed that you are prepared to co-operate with the Naval Officer in command in carrying out the wishes of the Admiralty in this matter.
