Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated 2nd August, 1888.

Ordered, "That a return be laid before this House showing the number of committals of children to industrial schools on Magistrates' orders from 1st January, 1883, to 31st March, 1888; showing separately the committals under subsections (1) and (3) of section 16 of 'The Industrial Schools Act, 1882,' and also showing the several charitable-aid districts in which the committals have been made."—(Mr. JONES.)
