for non-payment of rent.

The audited statement of accounts enclosed herewith shows a considerable increase in amount of rent collected over that of 1888. No doubt this was due to the improvement in farming interests in this district last year. The Commissioners have, nevertheless, had to write off £166 11s. as rent I have, &c., Wm. P.
