I have carefully considered your despatch, and appreciate the difficulties of your position; but I have no hesitation in advising acceptance of your Responsible Advisers' advice. It does not appear to be a case of swamping the Council.

I will state fully reasons by despatch; but you should at once re-open matter with Ministers, and waive your objections to their proposal.
