It was expected that the Cable Company's receipts from Press messages for 1892 would be maintained under the reduced rate. This is not the case, and the contributing colonies have therefore to make up to the Company three-fourths of the difference between the receipts for 1892 and 1893, the Company bearing the other quarter of the loss.

New Zealand's outward telegraph cable business for 1893, compared with the business for
