#### ORDERS OF REFERENCE.

Extracts from the Journals of the Bouse of Representatives.
Thursday, the Hith Day of July, 1940.

Ordered, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting of ten members, to consider all matters relating to public health, infectious diseases, contagious diseases, hospitals, and to local authorities having charge of these matters, and to other matters affecting public health which may be referred to it: the Committee to consist of Mr. Anderton, Mr. Boswell, the Hon. Mr. Cobbe, Mr. Coleman, Mr. Doidge, Mr. Kyle, Mr. Richards, Mr. Roy, Mrs. Stewart, and the Mover "—(Hon. Mr. Armstrong.)

Ordered, "That during the present session all Select Committees appointed by the House have leave to sit on days on which the House is not sitting, provided that when it is proposed to sit on any such day at least three days' notice shall be given to each member of the Committee of the date of the sitting."—(Right Hon. Mr. Fraser.)

Wednesday, the  $21\mathrm{st}$  Day of August, 1940.

Ordered, "That the Health Amendment Bill be referred to the Public Health Committee."—(Hon. Mr. Armstrong.)

FRIDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1940.

Ordered, "That the number of members of the Public Health Committee be increased (by leave) to cleven members and that Mr. Paikea be added to the Committee."— (Hon. Mr. Armstrong.)
