I have the honour to report that in the opinion of the Committee the petition should be referred to the Government for favourable consideration. The Committee is also of the opinion that the medical evidence from the doctors, who attended the petitioner's husband for some years prior to his death, definitely shows that his decease was connected with his war injury. Evidence of attributability can be adduced from the fact that the husband of the petitioner was a war pensioner from the date of his discharge.
