Extracts from the Journals of the House of Representatives

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF JULY, 1948

Ordered, "That all petitions not finally dealt with during the session of 1947, be again referred to the same Committees as they were referred to during the said session."—(Right Hon. Mr. FRASER.)

Ordered, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting of nine members, to consider all matters relating to school-teachers, education, and public instruction generally, training of public-school teachers, higher education, technical education, manual instruction, and such other matters affecting education as may be referred to it: the Committee to consist of Mr. Algie, Mr. Bodkin, Rev. Mr. Carr, Mr. Freer, Mr. Oram, Mr. Petrie, Mr. Rae, Mr. Wilson, and the Mover."—(Hon. Mr. McCOMBS.)
