TRADE-UNIONS.

There were no registrations under "The Trade-union Act, 1878," during the year. The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, allowing trade-unions to be registered as industrial unions, is bringing about the cancellation of a number of registrations under the former statute, as the provisions of the two Acts are somewhat in conflict.
