“PREFERENTIAL AND RECIPROCAL TRADE ACT, 1903”

(EXTRA DUTY COLLECTED AND AMOUNT OF DUTY REMITTED UNDER).

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 5th day of October, 1904.

Ordered, “That there be laid before this House a return showing the total amount of remissions of Customs duties on tea and other articles since the coming into operation of ‘The Preferential and Reciprocal Trade Act, 1903,’ up to the 30th June, 1904; the return to give separately the articles and the difference as to what would have been collected had the law not been altered.”—(Mr. WOOD.)
