Visited 29th July, 1904.—Now that the Grey River Hospital is accessible easily by rail, a cottage hospital, where emergency cases could be treated, and whence all cases capable of being transferred could be sent to Greymouth, would be ample for the needs of this town. To effect this reform, an Old People's Home should be provided in the Grey Valley, and the Greymouth Hospital plans completed.
