Visited 11th January, 1905, and 24th May, 1905.—The old Hospital in this place was built without any rational plan, and cannot now be added to, and, besides, the white pine which entered so largely into its construction is so drilled by the borer that it has become unsafe. A fine new Hospital has been designed by Mr. Atkins, of Wanganui, who made so good a job of the Hospital there, and I am confident he will do this equally well. As regards the actual working of this institution, I found everything in a very satisfactory state, reflecting great credit on Dr. Douglass and his staff. There were forty-six patients on the day of my visit. The Matron, Miss Rothwell, is assisted by a staff of nine nurses. Very large ideas prevail in this district as to the completeness of the Hospital organization required.
