APPLICATIONS FOR POSITIONS IN THE RAILWAY SERVICE:
PARTICULARS RELATIVE TO REJECTIONS.

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 25th July, 1905.

Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a return showing (1) how many applications for positions in the public railway service of this colony have been rejected during the past three years (a) on the score of being medically unfit, (b) on the score of being unable to furnish the necessary educational standards; (2) what fee is paid to medical gentlemen for examination of candidates."—(Mr. JENNINGS.)
