Conveyance of Children to Public Schools.

The basis of payment made to Education Boards on account of the conveyance or board of children attending public schools is contained in the Department's circular memoranda of the 4th June, 1907, and the 5th June, 1909, addressed to Education Boards, which are here reprinted for general information :—

“ *Conveyance.*—To assist Education Boards in making the arrangements for conveyance of children from outlying localities to central public schools, contemplated by section 47 of the Act, the Government will make an allowance to Boards under the following conditions :—

“ 1. No payment will be made for any child under ten years of age unless the distance from his home to the school is over three miles by the nearest road, nor for any child of ten years of age or upwards unless the distance from his home to the school is over four miles by the nearest road.

“ 2. The system of conveyance may be organized or provided by the Board, by School Committees, by the residents of the localities concerned, or by individual parents.

“ 3. In any system of conveyance organized or provided by the Board, or by School Committees, special consideration shall be given to the care of the younger children.
