DOMINION'S FINANCES

(MEMORANDUM SHOWING STATE OF) AS AT 30TH JUNE, 1912.

Laid on the Table of the House, by leave, by the Minister of Finance (Hon. Mr. Myers).

I desire to put before honourable members a very brief statement of the financial position of the Dominion.

It gives me much pleasure to state that the condition of the country's finances is very sound.

The revenue for the year ending the 31st March last was the record one of £11,032,544.
