LAND-TAX

(PROPORTION OF) DERIVED FROM URBAN LAND AND RURAL LAND.

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 9th July, 1913.

Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a return showing—(1) What proportion of the revenue received during 1912-13 from the graduated land-tax was derived from taxes on (a) urban land, and (b) on rural land; and (2) what proportion of the increase in revenue received from the graduated land-tax for 1912-13 over the previous year is derived from taxes on (a) urban land, and (b) rural land."—(Mr. Myers.)

RETURN.

1. The revenue from the graduated land-tax for 1912–13 was £251,275: of this urban land paid £71,191 and rural land £180,084.

2. The increase in the revenue from the graduated land-tax for 1912-13 over the previous year was £46,161; of this it is estimated urban land paid £13,078 and rural land £33,083.
