are known in some countries as "petty patents" for matter which, while involving skill and ingenuity leading to a useful result, hardly come within the definition of "invention."

4. The Prime Minister would be glad to lean whether any question of the kind referred to has been considered by His Majesty's Government, and would appreciate an expression of your views on the subject.
