There is therefore on the whole a small decrease in membership equal to 1.8 per cent.—a not unexpected result in view of the diversion of young lives to the war and the policy of societies in ceasing to initiate members of military age.

The total funds of the societies and branches as on the 31st December, 1915, amounted to £1,852,355, made up as follows: Sick and Funeral Funds (inclusive of amounts transferred to special funds out of surplus), £1,699,790; Medical and Management Funds, goods, &c., £152,565. Dividing the total funds by the number of members at the end of the year it is found the average capital per member is now £25 7s. 4d.
