- C.—Men at present unfit for active service beyond the seas, but fit for service in New Zealand in connection with or for the purposes of the present war: (1) Those to proceed to the C1 Camp for training; (2) those permanently unfit for service outside New Zealand.
- D.—Men permanently unfit, either for active service beyond the seas or for any service in New Zealand in connection with or for the purposes of the present war.
