Although these figures still show a slight decrease in membership, the percentage loss is reduced from 2·7 per cent. in 1917 to 1·8 per cent. in 1918. This is the first year since 1914 with the initiations in excess of the exits through arrears, and the figures would have been still more favourable but for the epidemic mortality.
