REPORT OF THE CONTROLLER AND AUDITOR-GENERAL.

The Controller and Auditor-General has the honour, in compliance with section 84, subsection (2), of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, to submit to Parliament the accompanying statement of accounts prepared by the Treasury for the financial year ended 31st March, 1922, and to report as follows:—

After entering upon my duties as Controller and Auditor-General in January last I took the earliest opportunity of visiting the chief centres of the Dominion, with a view of ascertaining the position regarding the audit of local authorities and other accounts in the local centres. A careful inspection of the system of audit obtaining generally in regard to Government accounts under the provisions of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, has also been made.

The ordinary duties carried out by Audit may be classified under the following heads:—

- (1.) Audit of the receipts and expenditure of all local bodies.
- (2.) Audit of Government stores and property.
- (3.) Checking of Government loans and public debt and Treasury expenditure.
- (4.) Audit of departmental balance-sheets.
- (5.) Audit of receipts and expenditure of Government Departments.

LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

The work of auditing local bodies' accounts has been carefully and well done, but unfortunately, owing to insufficiency of staff, in some instances the work is in arrear.

The vast increase in the revenues of local authorities during the past ten years, all of which must, of course, be audited, is a feature which is liable to be overlooked when considering the capabilities of the Audit staff. A reference to local-body statistics will show that while in 1910–11 the total of receipts of these bodies (excluding Hospital and Education Boards) for that year was £5,541,284, the sum for the year 1919–20 was £10,959,798—practically a doubling of the receipts in ten years. These sums are receipts only, and do not include outstanding rates, &c., and the expenditure, all of which must, of course, be checked in the routine of audit.

For general information I may state that the numbers of local governing bodies existing at the end of 1921, the accounts of which require to be audited by the Government, were as follows: Boroughs, 115; counties, 129; Drainage Boards, 61; Education Boards and bodies, 63; Electric-power Boards, 21; Fire Boards, 36; Harbour districts, 33; Hospital Boards, 45; Local Railway Boards, 3; Maori Land Boards, 7; River Boards, 51; Road Boards, 82; Town Boards, 70; Tramway Boards, 2; Water-supply Boards, 7; Cemetery Trusts, 327; and Domain Boards, 658.

Of these bodies, the Electric-power Boards are rapidly increasing, and are likely to continue to do so.

At the present time, when the Treasury is finding it necessary to curtail expenditure as much as possible, it is not desirable to increase the Audit staff if it can be avoided, and I am endeavouring, therefore, to so arrange the system that some members of the headquarters staff may be spared to strengthen the district inspectional staff.

I am pleased to be able to record that local bodies as a rule have assisted the Audit officers in every possible way, and the only complaint that has been received from them is on account of the work being in arrears.

In addition to many adjustments of technical irregularities by Audit during the year, special action was taken in respect of the various classes of local bodies as follows:—

AUDIT OF GOVERNMENT STORES AND PROPERTY.

This very important branch of Audit work has not in the past received that attention which its importance requires. Although a Government Stores Auditor has been appointed, it is found that without the help of some Assistant Inspectors a complete audit cannot be carried out.

In very few Government Departments is the system of control over stores efficient. Stores are the equivalent of cash, but many public officers do not seem to have recognized this fact, nor have they been called upon to observe the same care and attention with regard to the accounting for public stores and property as has been enforced in regard to accounting for public moneys. The Public Revenues Act very properly makes no distinction between a defalcation in stores and a defalcation in public moneys—both are equally punishable.

Owing to the failure to recognize this principle I fear that very considerable losses have occurred in the past—losses which have remained undetected owing to inefficient control. The promulgation of multitudinous regulations and instructions, with subsequent amendments, is calculated to cause confusion and does not necessarily bring about efficiency. The only method by which efficiency can be attained is by establishing a sound system and by ensuring observance of that system by regular inspections by an Audit officer.

The present form in which the Public Accounts are presented to the House makes it impossible to include in those accounts any reference to value of stores and property of the Government. It is hoped that the decision of the Government that departmental balance-sheets shall be prepared annually will to some extent provide a remedy for this defect.

The practice of piecemeal purchasing, and purchasing "for immediate use," has been prevalent in the Service, with all its attendant evils. A Stores Purchase Board has been constituted by the Government which will regulate the system of purchasing by Departments and should materially assist in eliminating many of the existing evils.

The system of writing-off stores which have been lost or stolen has been perfunctorily carried out in most Departments. It is essential that all Government stores and property required to be written off should be so written off under a uniform system, and duly reported to Parliament. Improvements have been effected in some Departments in this respect. In the Defence Department, for instance, a sound costing system has been instituted.

The Audit Department aims at introducing a system in connection with all Departments, which will enable departmental costs to be compared with trade costs of a similar nature, and will make it possible for Parliament to judge of the efficient and economical working of the departmental establishments or otherwise. Such a system also, from an administrative point of view, is advisable so as to enable executive officers to control the expenditure which is incurred under their supervision.

The following departmental systems have been partially inspected: Agriculture, Defence, Education, Marine, Mental Hospitals, Mines, Police, Prisons, Public Works, and Public Health. The investigations have proved the existence of many defects. Stores have been purchased and never brought on charge; stores have been written off without sufficient inquiry and without the authority of Parliament; there has been insufficient check on deliveries, which opens the door to short deliveries and other frauds; insufficiency of check and ease with which articles can be written off open the door to theft; there has also been an absence of a proper costing system and stocktaking, rendering it impossible to ascertain if peculation is going on. Audit investigations have also proved that there have in some cases been free issues of Government goods to Government officers, or issues at reduced cost. Officers of the Public Service are not entitled to derive, either directly or indirectly, any such advantages from their status in the Service.

LOANS AND PUBLIC DEBT, ETC.

The total amount of loans outstanding at 31st March, 1922, was £219,054,385, including Public Debt Account, £206,434,435, and State Advances Debt Account, £12,619,950.

Of the total securities outstanding representing the public debt, £11,288,180 consists of interdepartmental liabilities only, and the relative securities are shown under "Debenture Sales Account" and "Inscribed Stock Sales Account" in the general balance-sheet relating to the public debt.

Public debt loans amounting to £731,325 were paid off during the year as follows:-

Loans amounting to £157,870 were raised during the year for redemption of loans falling due in 1922-23. This amount therefore appears twice on the debt at 31st March, 1922.

In addition to the transactions already stated, public-debt Loans amounting to £4,289,125 have been renewed during the year by the issue to the holders of £4,270,975 debentures and £18,150 inscribed stock. Loans amounting to £2,826,095 were paid off out of moneys raised by the issue of an equal amount of debentures and inscribed stock. Securities to the amount of £22,816,325 were issued in conversion or replacement of securities of an equal value.

Included in the amount of £22,816,325 is an amount of £22,000,000, debentures issued in place of an equal amount of memorandum security, representing advances made by the Imperial Government to this Dominion during the period of the war. The amount now represented by memorandum security is £208,931.

State Advances debt loans to the amount of £207,500 have been renewed by the issue to the holders of fresh securities of an equal amount, leaving the amount of State Advances debt securities outstanding unchanged.

Statutory authority to make advances on behalf of other Governments was passed last session. Such advances had previously been made without statutory authority. Advances were made to the amount of £98,923, of which £48,396 was recovered, leaving an amount of £50,527 outstanding on 31st March, 1922.

The authority contained in section 4 of the Finance Act, 1919, has for the first time been used to recoup to the Ordinary Revenue Account the sinking-fund charges paid by that account in respect of loans raised for the purposes of the various separate accounts. As the revenues of the separate accounts are in some cases insufficient to cover these interest and sinking fund charges, the effect of claiming from those accounts the full amount of interest and sinking fund is to recover portion of these charges out of loan-moneys. Such a state of things is undesirable, particularly as regards the sinking-fund charges.

The present practice by Departments of crediting various receipts to their votes has not proved satisfactory. Should there be any excess in the amount of credits actually realized over the amount estimated and submitted with the estimates to Parliament, this excess becomes available for expenditure in addition to the actual amount voted. Representations have been made to the Treasury with a view of improving the system, so that a more complete parliamentary control of expenditure may be ensured.

When auditing the Receivers' Accounts for Wellington during the year it was found in some cases that the system of internal check in operation was not quite satisfactory, and the Audit examination resulted in a more efficient check being adopted as well as the detection of several small defalcations

The Treasury statement has been examined and found correct.

There are no discrepancies between the statement and books of the Treasury.

The various accounts as under, dealing with the operations of the Public Account for the period under review, have been duly audited, certified to, and presented to Parliament as required by the Public Revenues Act, 1910:—

Abstract of the Public Account. Civil List Account. Appropriation Account. Unauthorized Expenditure Account.

AUDIT OF DEPARTMENTAL BALANCE-SHEETS.

Owing to the lateness of the receipt of departmental balance-sheets last year it was impossible to arrange for their complete audit, but it is hoped this year to make a more thorough examination. It is pointed out that it will take two or three years to bring all balance-sheets into line and to have the valuation of the very varied class of assets completed. The valuation of roads and bridges; post-offices, telegraph-lines; material and instruments; railways; scenic forests; plantations, &c., presents difficulties which will take time to overcome. Difficulties also exist in arriving at the approximate amounts of revenue of a Department for which the cash is received by another Department. For instance, there is difficulty in allotting the revenue earned by the Stamp Department and the Postal Department in respect of stamps sold.

It is difficult also for Audit to check the dissection of capital and revenue expenditure in some Departments, for the reason that the schedules held by the Department contain very brief particulars of the services rendered, while the appropriations made by Parliament contain items covering both capital and revenue expenditure. This could be overcome if in the Appropriations capital and revenue expenditure were shown separately.

In cases where Departments control subsidiary branches the accounts of each branch should be shown separately to enable a proper analysis of the various departmental operations to be made.

Those Departments which are non-revenue-producing have not kept a double-entry system of accounts, and they compile their Income and Expenditure Account from the net-expenditure book, and some difficulty exists when examining the balance-sheets in determining whether all sundry creditors and debtors have been brought to charge.

By co-operation between the various Departments and Audit these troubles can all be overcome. A decided improvement is noticed in those Departments whose accounts have been examined this year.

AUDIT OF RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE OF GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

I find that a great deal of work is performed in checking details of receipts and expenditure in connection with some of the Government Departments when these details have already been subjected to a departmental audit. I am at present making inquiries with a view, if possible, of altering the system in cases where there is a complete and reliable local audit within the Department itself. In this investigation I am greatly indebted to the Public Service Commissioner for the assistance of his staff.

The postal-draft system of payment of sums up to £5, instituted by the Treasury with the object of ensuring prompt payment to tradesmen and others, has operated successfully in the Auckland and Wellington districts, claims to the number of 23,000 having been passed within the latter district during the year.

Attention is directed to the large number of Audit queries rendered necessary by irregularities in claims for travelling-expenses by Government officers. The idea seems to prevail with some

officers that because a limit is set to the amount for which a receipt to support expenditure is required by regulation, it is not improper to charge that limit when the cost has been less. It should be unnecessary to emphasize the fact that travelling-expense claims should be made only for the actual amounts disbursed, due regard being also given to the use of the least expensive mode of transit. The Audit Office must rely to a large extent on the certificate of the departmental officer in these cases, and it is essential in the public interest that proper care should be exercised by certifying officers before signing the certificate. Unfortunately, Audit finds that many officers take little trouble to subject these claims to any scrutiny before certifying.

GENERAL.

The Audit Office has suffered considerable reduction in staff during the year, the number of officers being now 123, or twenty-three less than last year. The reduction is represented chiefly by

temporary clerks who were either dispensed with or resigned.

The past practice of examining the War Expenses and Repatriation Accounts concurrently with expenditure therefrom has been continued, but the work has been greatly reduced. The following classes of work have absorbed the greatest part of the time spent on the examination: Retrospective allowances, of which 517 were passed during the period, bringing the total to the 31st March up to 16,173; gratuities to the number of 627 were passed during the period, bringing the grand total to 94,810; retrospective camp pay to the number of 1,500 during the period bringing the total to 17,156.

The work of the Imperial Supplies Branch is now so much reduced that the audit examination is principally confined to the shipping and storage accounts of wool. The examination of the Butter Equalization Fund required a large amount of work, but at the present date only two claims have

still to be disposed of.

Arrangements have been made for a continuous audit of the operations of the Meat-producers' Board.

During my visit to London over a year ago I inspected the Audit staff in the High Commissioner's Office. Two Audit officers perform the whole of the London work, which entails a thorough examination of the expenditure made by the High Commissioner on behalf of all Departments of the Government, in addition to the audit of all financial operations by the Treasury. I am pleased to be able to report that the work is being satisfactorily performed.

IMPERFECT VOUCHERS.

In terms of section 69 of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, the authority of the Minister of Finance was given to pass certain claims without the production of supporting vouchers, on the grounds (1) that receipts were not obtained, (2) that it was not possible to obtain them, or (3) that they were lost and could not be replaced. The total of claims so passed was £2,479 17s. 4d., the details of which appear in a schedule attached hereto.

Authority contained in section 70 of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, enabled the Audit Office to pass certain vouchers as shown in the schedule attached, which were defective for want of

certificates or other relative documents.

Losses, Deficiencies, Debts irrecoverable, etc., to be written off.

The Audit Office submits a schedule of losses or deficiencies in cash, stores, or supply, for which parliamentary authority will be required before such can be written off. The total amount is £49,498 18s.

The reason for writing off is in each case stated in the schedule, the items requiring special mention being the following: -

SURCHARGES.

A number of irregular transactions necessitating the issue of surcharges occurred during the year, the particulars are as follows:—

Defence Department.

Captain McGee, Command Paymaster, Southern District, N.Z. Army Pay Department, Christchurch, was surcharged with the amount of £10, representing an overpayment of cost-of-living increase to ex-Quartermaster Λ. W. Shallerass, N.Z. Permanent Staff (temporary), for which he was responsible. The amount was paid.

Lands and Survey Department.

W. E. Cockroft, Cashier, District Lands and Survey Office, Wellington, was surcharged the sum of £80 2s. 11d., representing amounts remitted by money-orders from Crown tenants and cashed by him for T. S. Dickson, who had stolen them. For the theft Dickson received six months' imprisonment and eighteen months' reformative treatment, as shown below, and Cockroft, on appeal to the Minister in terms of the Public Revenues Act, was relieved of the surcharge with the exception of £5.

Repatriation Department.

Frank Henry Burbush, Repatriation Department, Auckland, was surcharged with the amount of £282. This officer was responsible for seeing that proper insurance was effected on chattels secured by bill of sale to cover loans granted to three returned soldiers for a furniture business. The surchargee, through negligence, omitted to see that a policy was taken out in the name of the King, consequently when the premises were burnt down no insurance was recoverable. On appeal to the Minister of Finance, under section 67 of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, he was relieved of the surcharge.

Stamp Duties Department.

Harold Beanland Walton, Stamp Duties Department, Auckland, was surcharged with the amount of £20 in respect to the loss of two £10 stamps from the stock of the Deputy Commissioner of Stamp Duties, Auckland. Mr. Walton appealed to the Minister of Finance, with the result that the appeal was allowed, and the amount will be written off.

State Forest Service.

Adam Duncan Macfarlane, State Forest Service, was surcharged with the amount of £16 13s. 2d., being expenditure in excess of the ruling market rates for cabinets purchased from Lankshear's Limited, Wellington, instead of through the Government Printer. The officer surcharged appealed to the Minister, with the result that he was relieved wholly of the amount of the surcharge.

Percy Morgan Page, Forest Ranger, relief works, Rangitikei sand-dunes, was surcharged on the 7th March with the amount of £16 6s. 11d., being the value of fencing-material stolen from Himitangi flag station whilst in his charge. Page appealed to the Minister of Finance, and the appeal was allowed.

Wheat Controller's Office.

Arnold Wright Smith, Assistant Wheat Controller, Christchurch, was surcharged with the amount of £70, being the cost of repairs rendered necessary to a motor-car the property of the New Zealand Government. The grounds on which the surcharge was made are that whilst in his care Mr. Smith through negligence permitted persons without authority to use the car and inflict damage thereto in excess of the amount stated. The surchargee has appealed to the Minister of Finance.

DEFALCATIONS AND SHORTAGES.

There have been several cases of defalcation by Government employee, and proceedings were instituted against the delinquents whenever possible. The following are the particulars:—

Defence Department.

Licutenant W. Reeve, Quartermaster, N.Z. Army Medical Corps, Auckland, was found guilty of theft of Defence stores amounting to £43, admitted to twelve months' probation, and discharged from the Forces

Captain William Alfred Gustafson was on the 14th December, 1921, charged with the misappropriation of public funds amounting to £243 10s. 11d. belonging to the 2nd Mounted Rifles Regiment. He was committed for trial to the Supreme Court, New Plymouth, on the 15th February, when a verdict of "Not guilty" was given, the case being considered to be one of muddlement rather than of criminality. Discharged from the Forces.

Thomas Balfour Mason, who had been, prior to demobilization, Manager of the Canteen Funds, Trentham: Action arose out of a suit instituted by the committee of management of the Trentham Military Camp Canteen to recover the sum of £1,227 4s. 10d., plus interest, for which they alleged their manager was liable by reason of fraudulent conduct on his part. The Court's finding was that there was insufficient evidence of theft or of fraudulently failing to account for the goods or the proceeds, but assessed damages for trespass at £5 10s., and gave judgment for the £34 in respect of tanks which had been charged to the Canteen Committee.

W. F. Harrison, temporary clerk, Defence Department: Overpayment of £39 11s. 3d. was made to Private W. F. Harrison, who by passing himself off as a married man obtained wages at a higher rate than laid down by regulation. The whereabouts of Harrison are unknown to the police.

Labour Department.

James Ross Fraser, Clerk, Labour Department, was charged with the theft of £15 18s. 7d., the property of the Labour Department. He was admitted to twelve months' probation, ordered to pay the costs of prosecution, and dismissed the service.

Lands and Survey Department.

Thomas Smith Dickson, a temporary clerk in the Accountants' Branch of the District Lands and Survey Office, Wellington, stole Post Office orders remitted to the Lands and Survey Department by Crown tenants, amounting to £86 13s. 8d. He was charged with theft, and sentenced to six months' imprisonment and eighteen months' reformative treatment. Dismissed from the service.

Marine Department.

John Norman McLean, temporary clerk, Marine Department, was charged at the Magistrate's Court with committing thefts amounting to £24 5s. by collecting certain fees for machinery certificates and fraudulently diverting them to his own use. Restitution of the amount was made. McLean was admitted to probation for a term of two years, and dismissed from the service.

Mines Department.

Arthur Gilbert Laurenson, Manager, Government Firewood Depot, Thorndon, was charged with the theft of £70 received for sale of firewood the property of the Crown, for which he had failed to account. He was admitted to two years' probation, and ordered to pay £2 2s. costs of the prosecution. Restitution was made. Dismissed the service.

Post and Telegraph Department.

C. H. Pugh, of the Postal Department, Wanganui, was charged with the theft of £105 1s. He pleaded guilty, was sentenced to two years' reformative treatment, and dismissed from the service. The practice adopted by him was to hold back collections made by him from the automatic franking-machines. Upon discovery he repaid the amount.

Public Works Department.

C. S. M. Johnson, Overseer, Public Works Department, Kahuika: On finding a shortage in his cash of £65 5s. 4d. he at once paid the amount to Public Account and put the matter in the hands of the police. Investigation has failed to throw any light on the cause of the disappearance of this money.

Registrar-General's Office.

E. A. Selman, Clerk in Registrar-General's Office, failed to account for search fees amounting to £26 2s. 10d. Investigation showed general laxity of control in the Registrar-General's Office resulting in irregularities. The amount was deducted from Selman's salary, and he was transferred to another branch of the Service where he would not be required to handle money. His annual leave and annual increment were withheld for one year.

Repatriation Department.

A. H. D. MacDougall, Clerk, Repatriation Department, Dunedin: Irregularities amounting to £184 2s. 6d. were discovered in the Repatriation Department, Dunedin, and Court proceedings taken against MacDougall. The Court convicted MacDougall of forgery and defalcation, and admitted him to three years' probation. Restitution of the amount was made, and he was dismissed from the service. Further defalcations have since been discovered, amounting to £175, and trial is set down for the Supreme Court sitting in August.

Stamp Duties Department.

T. U. Bristow, First Clerk in the Stamp Duties Department, Napier, was sentenced in the Supreme Court, Napier, to six months' imprisonment for theft of £150, the property of the New Zealand Government. Bristow had removed stamps of this value from documents which he afterwards destroyed. Dismissed from the service.

State Fire Insurance.

John Tammadge, Agent, Te Kuiti: This Agent failed to account for all the premiums collected by him, and at the end of April, 1921, a deficiency of £47 12s. 5d. was discovered. Tammadge was allowed by the Department to resign.

George H. Nunnerly, who was appointed Agent at Te Kuiti after Tammadge's resignation, also failed to account for all his collections, and a deficiency of £86 12s. 10d. was discovered in January, 1922. Nunnerly was also allowed by the Department to resign.

Restitution in full has now been made in both cases.

State Forest Service.

Forest Ranger, Greenvale, reported the loss of blankets amounting to £9. As Quartermaster Dobson, who was in charge of the labourers and responsible for the blankets, has left the Service, no action has been taken to recover the amount.

Public Works Department.

The Power-house Superintendent, Lake Coleridge, reported that on the receipt of a registered package from Christchurch containing salaries the cash therein was checked and found to be short by £48 12s. 7d. The police took the matter in hand, but were unable to obtain a clue to the disappearance of the money, and, as responsibility for the loss cannot be fixed on any official, the amount will be written off.
