

REPORT OF COOK ISLANDS ADMINISTRATION.

Rarotonga, 25th April, 1923.

FINANCE.

The revenue for the year amounted to the very satisfactory total of £19,790 18s. 1d., exceeding that of the previous year by £2,071 11s. 9d. The expenditure was £19,119 4s. 7d.

From the Revenue and Expenditure Accounts set out hereunder it will be seen that the year's operations resulted in a cash credit balance of £2,802 14s. 5d.
