ADVANCES TO WORKERS BRANCH.

SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE-SHEET.

The Amendment Act of last session authorized the advancing of loans not exceeding 95 per cent. of the value of the security, in lieu of 75 per cent. as previously, to workers desirous of purchasing a dwelling-house, whilst to a worker electing to purchase a section and erect a dwellinghouse thereon authority was also given to advance not exceeding 95 per cent. of the cost of the land, building, and improvements. This liberal provision has resulted in a very marked increase of applications from those in search of homes.
