In accordance with subsections (14) and (15) of section 11 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1920, a schedule is appended giving the particulars prescribed for the period from the 11th November, 1920, the date of the passing of the Act, to the 31st March, 1924. There has been a considerable increase during the year in the area removed from the national endowment to afford the lessees an opportunity of acquiring the fee-simple, as a comparison of the following figures with last year's report will show:—

The total area comprised in the national endowment on the 31st March, 1924, was approximately 9,007,190 acres. Of this an area of 6,897,765 acres was held on lease or license, subdivided into 4,455 holdings, the annual rental payable being £138,780, while 1,692,240 acres have been set aside as provisional State forest. The total revenue derived from this endowment during the past year was £163,169.

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
