ORDERS OF REFERENCE.

Extracts from the Journals of the House of Representatives.

THURSDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF JULY, 1924.

Ordered, "That the Summer Time Bill be referred to a Select Committee to be set up by the House."—(MR. SIDNEY.)

TUESDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1924.

Ordered, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting of ten members, to whom shall be referred the Summer Time Bill, with power to call for persons and papers; three to be a quorum; the Committee to report within three weeks from date: the Committee to consist of Mr. Field, Mr. Girling, Mr. Hawken, Mr. Hockly, Mr. Jordan, Mr. Ransom, Mr. Smith, Mr. Sullivan, Mr. Williams, and the mover."—(MR. SIDNEY.)

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF AUGUST, 1924.

Ordered, "That Standing Order 219 be suspended, and that Mr. Tau Henare and the Hon. Mr. A. T. Ngata be added to the Committee on the Summer Time Bill."—(MR. SIDNEY.)
