MINING AND QUARRY ACCIDENTS.

In metalliferous mines, at which 1,733 men were ordinarily employed, there was no fatal accident and only one serious accident.

At stone-quarries under the Stone-quarries Act, employing 2,341 men, one person was killed and five persons met with serious injuries.

There were 5,374 persons ordinarily employed about the coal-mines, and there were ten persons killed and twenty-seven persons seriously injured.

SOCIAL AMENITIES AT MINING TOWNSHIPS.

Further facilities for recreation of miners and others at mining townships have been provided during the past year. At Roa a tennis-court, financed by the residents of the district, has been constructed. The residents of Denniston, with the assistance of the Westport Coal Co., provided a bowling-green for the use of miners and the public. The facilities provided for athletic sports, &c., in mining towns continue to be extensively used and patronized by the miners and the general public.
