LEAD PROCESS REGULATIONS.

These regulations were issued in 1925 to protect workers from the danger of lead poisoning in factories where lead paints are manufactured or prepared, and also in places where painting operations are carried on. No complaints regarding non-compliance with the regulations have been received during the year, and only one case of suspected lead poisoning was reported. The worker concerned was suspended from his employment for a fortnight.

TAILORING TRADE REGULATIONS.

These regulations were gazetted in 1925 to prevent the misuse of such expressions as "tailormade" and "hand-made" as applied to garments made to measure, some of which are made partly by machine process. A number of complaints were received during the year, but in only three instances was it found that a breach of the regulations had been committed. In one case the clothier concerned was advertising factory-made garments as "tailor-made" by means of hand-bills, and prompt action by the Inspector resulted in the discontinuance of the advertisement, before any appreciable number of the bills had been distributed. In the remaining two cases letters of warning were sent to the firms concerned who were describing, by means of show-cards in the windows, suits made under factory conditions as suits "tailored" to measure.
