# GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS SUPERANNUATION FUND.

REPORT OF BOARD.

Laid before Parliament in pursuance of Section 124 of the Government Railways Act, 1926.

The Board has the honour to transmit for the information of Parliament the following report upon the transactions of the Government Railways Superannuation Fund for the year ended 31st March, 1937. The Revenue Account, Balance-sheet, and statements in connection therewith will be found appended.

The income for the year exceeded the expenditure by £3,866 14s.

Members' Contributions.—The income under this heading showed an increase of £15,500 0s. 1d. The number of contributors at 5 and 6 per cent. increased by 1,389 and 10, while contributors at 3, 4, 7, and 8 per cent. decreased by 64, 7, 8, and 1 respectively. The increase in amount of contributions is due to the restoration of salary and wages and to a large number of appointments to the permanent staff.

Contingent Contributors.—During the year 296 casual employees elected to contribute to the fund, so that in the event of their subsequently being permanently appointed they would not be faced with a liability in respect of service prior to permanent appointment. The total number of employees so contributing at the end of the year under review was 469, and the amount standing to their credit £15.624 8s. 5d.

Subsidy.—In addition to the sum of £170,000 paid into the fund by the Working Railways Department, a subsidy of £65,000 was received from the Treasury in accordance with the provisions of

section 17 of Finance Act (No. 2), 1934.

Interest.—The interest earned amounted to £64,610 17s. 6d., a decrease of £1,266 6s. 7d. as compared with the previous year. Table D, Statement of Investments, shows that the average rate of interest on securities held at the 31st March, 1937, was 4.415 per cent., and the average rate earned on the mean funds for the year 5.259 per cent., as against 4.577 per cent. and 5.484 per cent. respectively

for the previous year.

Life Allowances.—The expenditure on account of life allowances to members amounted to £420,208 14s. 3d., an increase of £639 5s. 7d. as compared with the figures for the previous year. Year ended 31st March, 1936, showed a decrease under this heading of £2,908 3s. 2d. The increased expenditure on account of life allowances is mainly due to the actuarial revaluation of the allowances of 108 members who were retired under the provisions of section 14 of the Finance Act, 1931. As from 1st April, 1937, the additional amount involved by the revaluation is being met by the Working Railways Department. Table A, Statement of Allowances, shows that the average amount of the eighty-seven allowances granted during the year was £139 10s. 2d. and the average amount of ninety-one allowances discontinued was £144 10s. 8d.

Allowances to Widows and Children.—The expenditure under the heading of allowances to widows and children showed a decrease of £410 6s. 10d. The sum of £12,704 6s. 9d. was received from the Working Railways Account during the year on account of the increased payments to widows and

children, as provided in section 114, Part III, of the Government Railways Act, 1926.

Approval was received for the continuance of the cost-of-living bonus to annuitants in cases of special hardship where the allowance was less than £100, the amount of bonus granted being sufficient to bring the allowance up to £100, but with a maximum bonus of £26. The bonus is provided for out of the Working Bailways Account, and is not a charge on the Superannuation Fund.

At the 31st March, 1937, there were 2,310 members, 634 widows, and 326 children, making a total of 3,270 persons actually on the fund, involving an annual liability of £437,986 18s. 10d.
