

Member could be interrupted while speaking; in case of disorderly expressions, or infringement of the rules, it is only competent for an Honourable Member to call the Speaker's or Chairman's attention to the fact in as few words as possible.

On motion of Mr. Fitzgerald the Speaker left the Chair, and the House again resolved itself into Committee to resume the interrupted debate.

On the Speaker resuming the Chair, the Chairman reported progress, and obtained leave to sit again to-morrow.

On motion of Mr. Carleton, the Law Practitioners Bill was read a second time, and the consideration of the Bill in Committee ordered to stand an order of the day for Thursday next.

On motion of Mr. Fitzgerald, the Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole on the re-committal of the Revenues Bill.

On the Speaker resuming the Chair, the Chairman reported the Bill with amendments.

Report adopted; and, on motion of Mr. Fitzgerald, Bill read a third time, and *passed*.

Mr. Mackay, with the leave of the House, brought up the report of the Committee on Duties of Customs.
