ANALYSIS.

Title.

Preamble reciting New Zealand Constitution Act.

1. The sum of £5423 9s. 6d. to be paid out of Land and General Revenue for defraying excess of Expenditure for the year

ending 30th June, 1855. The sum of £33760 16s. 6d. to be paid out of Land and General Revenue for support of Civil Establishments, &c., of the General Government.

The sum of 1090 to be paid out of the Land

and General Revenue for Public Works. The sum of £4289 11s. 3d. to be paid out of the Land and General Revenue to defray the charges for services mentioned.

2. To be paid by Treasurer under Governor's warrant.

3. The surplus of said Revenue to be divided among the Provinces.

4. Treasurer to be allowed credit for all sums so paid,

AN Act to provide for the Appropriation of the Public Revenues Title. of New Zealand.

(Assented to September 15th, 1855.)

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Parliament Preamble reciding New holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Act. Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted, that after and subject to the payments to be made under the provisions therein contained, all the Revenues arising from taxes, duties, rates, and imposts levied in virtue of any Act of the General Assembly, and from the disposal of Waste Lands of the Crown, shall be subjected to be appropriated to such specific purposes, as by any Act of the said General Assembly shall be prescribed in that behalf, and
