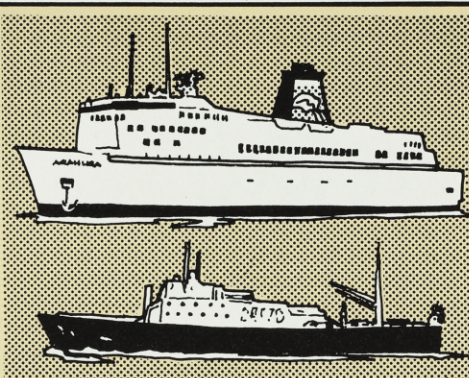
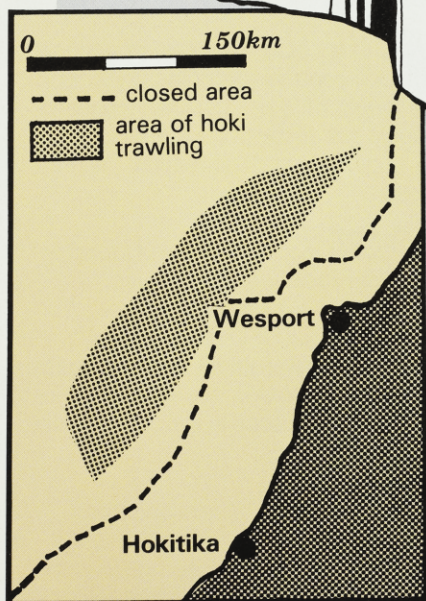
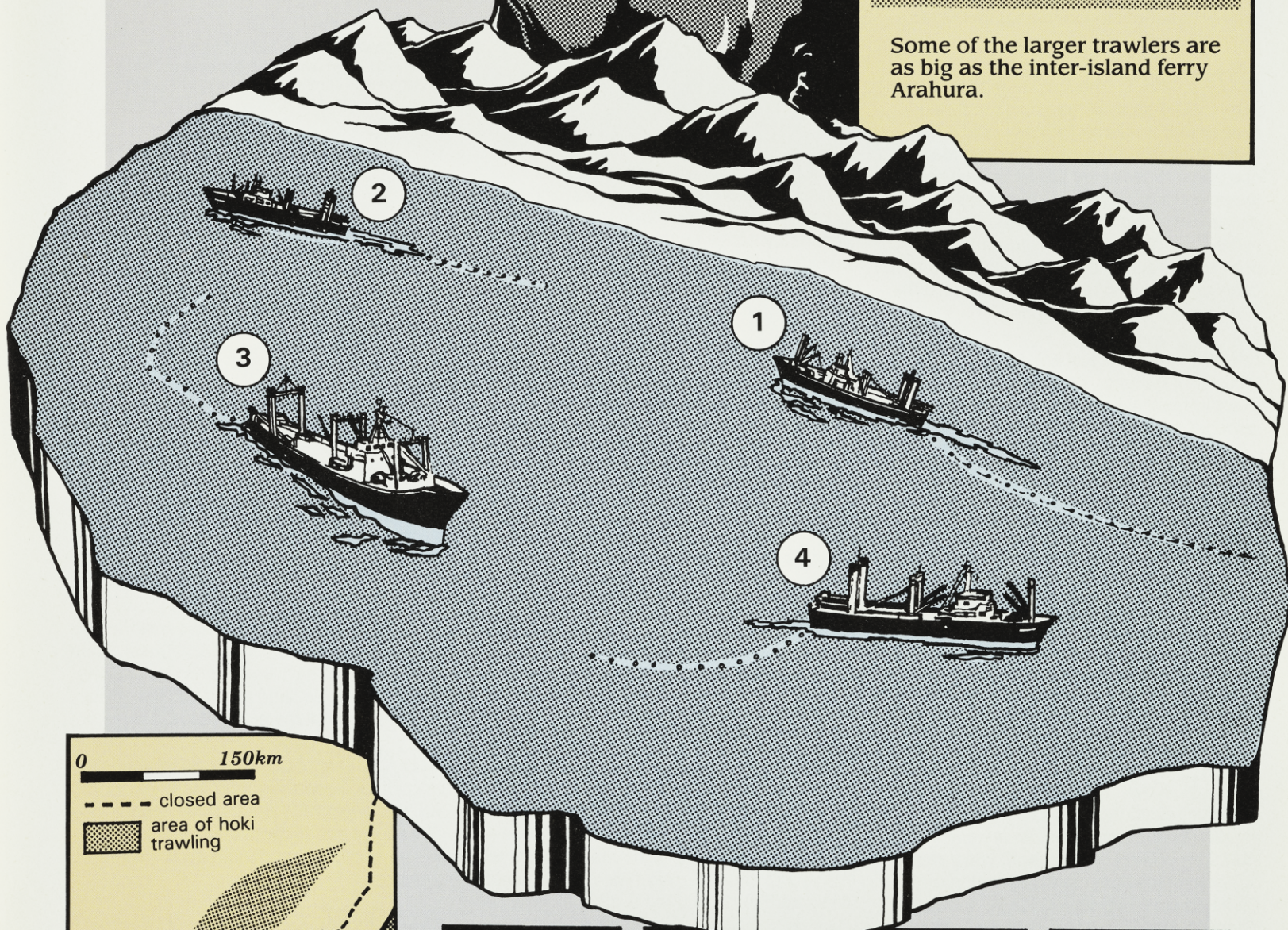


HOKI



Some of the larger trawlers are as big as the inter-island ferry Arahura.



- 1 -

A hoki trawler with net down at 400 metres on a typical run up the hoki fishery.

- 2 -

Trawler reaches the end of the run, pulls up the net to about 30 metres below the surface.

- 3 -

Trawler turns while dragging the net at 30 metres below. At this point seals dive into the net after the hoki.

- 4 -

Trawler completes turn, lowers net to 400 metres again with seals trapped in net.
