



In this illustrated guide to New Zealand fish and shellfish, emphasis is given to those of greatest interest to recreational and commercial fisherman. Arranged by family, the species are described, with notes on distribution, habitat, life history and, where known, population size. There are over 300 line drawings and colour photographs.



It is estimated that there are at least 20,000 species of insects in New Zealand and probably 90 percent of them are endemic. This gives New Zealand a very special status and our unique insect fauna is renowned throughout the world.

New Zealand has a rich and varied assortment of rivers, streams, lakes and wetlands that are home to a modest but fascinating and varied freshwater fish fauna. The Reed Field Guide to New Zealand Freshwater Fishes is a complete and easy-to-read reference to the fishes throughout New Zealand and her outlying islands, such as the Chathams. Each entry contains colour photographs, a line drawing and a distribution map and information on size, colour, features particular to the type of fish, distribution, habitat and diet.



Shorebirds make up a significant proportion of the New Zealand bird fauna. The best known of these are the gulls, the terns and perhaps the oystercatchers. Godwits and most of the lesser-known visiting shorebirds have migratory behaviour, nesting in the Arctic and travelling thousands of kilometres to spend time here in the southern summer.

This book gives a detailed introduction to common shore-birds, in the hope that this may stimulate readers to look more closely at the birds they see.
