The Orca • Ingrid Visser



Meet 18 spiders commonly found in New Zealand and some of their relatives from other countries. Find out where the spiders live and how they survive. Learn about spider classification, senses, spider silk and venom, as well as some fascinating spider myths and legends, including the real story of Little \$19.95 Miss Muffet.

Whales and Dolphins • Barbara Todd


Pull-out boxes contain important 'cool and amazing facts' about the different whales and dolphins found around New Zealand.


The Tuatara • Brian Parkinson


Find out about the tuatara's beginnings, survival, as well as breeding habits and behaviour, socialisation, and where it lives.
