

fate, tempt *phrasetoit* okewa (toitioikewa W.432 ‘speak beforehand of game etc., one is going to catch, thereby incurring pūhore’ pūhore W.305 ‘unsuccessful in fishing, an omen of ill success in fishing or fowling’)

frisbeen *noun* ripi (W.341 ‘small discs of bark thrown by children into the air in some game’)

fritter *noun* kao (W.94 ‘a preparation of kūmara, grated, cooked, and dried in the sun’)

half-time *noun* whakamatuatanga (W.195 ‘rest, pause after an effort’)

innings *noun* pāeke (Salmond *Hui* 153 ‘order of speaking where all the speakers of the local side are followed by the visitors’)

intellectual property rights *noun* mana whakairo hinengaro (mana W.172 ‘authority, control’ whakairo W.80 ‘ornament with a pattern, used of carving, tattooing, painting, weaving’ hinegaro W.51 ‘seat of the thoughts and emotions’)

iris *noun (eye)* mata-ā-ruru (W.185 ‘eye, rings of pāua shell inserted in carved work’)

jumbon *noun* waka ruarangi (waka rererangi common usage ‘aeroplane’ ruarangi W.350 ‘large, robust’)

keen-sighted *adjective* kanohi hōmiromiro (W.58 ‘said of one who has sharp sight for very small objects’)

left-handed *adjective* hemarehe (hema W.45 ‘left hand’ rehe W.333 ‘expert, neat-handed, deft person’)

macaroni *noun* tikohu parāoa (tikohu W.418 ‘hollowed, bent, curved’ parāoa < Eng. ‘flour’)

miniature *adjective* tauhena (W.405 ‘dwarfish, of small stature’)

myriapod *noun* waengero (wae W.472 ‘foot’ ngero W.233 ‘very many’)

narcissism *noun* whakatāupe (W.401 ‘regard oneself with admiration, i.e. bend over the wai whakaata’) **nearly** *adverb* kainamu (W.88 ‘be within a little of’) e.g. *Kei te aha te tāima? Kua kainamu ki te whā.*

nuclear warfare *noun* umu pongipongi (W.292 ‘an incantation and rite to cause death’)

one-on-one *phrase (basketball)* kura horahora (W.158 ‘spread out, extend, applied to a war party’)

ozone layer *noun* pekerangi (W.276 ‘screen, barrier, the outermost palisade of a complete stockade’)

parsnip *noun* uhi tea (uhi W.471 ‘root crops’ tea W.410 ‘white, light in colour’)

patchwork *noun* kānihinihi (kānihi W.94 ‘patch a garment’)

procrastinate *intransitive verb* waiho mō raurangi (waiho W.475 ‘let be’ raurangi W.330 ‘another time, another day’)

receptionist *noun* kiripaepae (kiri W.119 ‘person’ taupaepae W.400 ‘meet and escort visitors in as they arrive’)

revolving door *noun* kūaha kōtiri (kūaha W.154 ‘gateway, entrance’ kōtiri W.149 ‘come or go one at a time’)

rhythm *noun* manawataki (manawa W.174 ‘mind, spirit, heart’ taki W.371 ‘tow with a line, lead, bring along’ taki TM ‘beat’)

saccharine *noun* āwenewene (W.24 ‘very sweet’)

safe *adjective (softball)* oraiti (W.241 ‘escaping with difficulty’)

solstice, winter *noun* ihu o Hinetakurua (ihu W.75 ‘nose, bow of a canoe, etc.’ Hinetakurua personification of winter Best *Astronomical Knowledge* 18)

spore *noun* tihenga atua (tihe W.415 ‘sneeze’ whare atua W.489 ‘mushroom’)

tradesperson *noun* ringarehe (ringa W.34 ‘hand’ rehe W.33 ‘expert, deft person’)

tandem *adjective* taupiri (taupiripiri Best *Games and Pastimes* 19, 31 ‘style of footrace in which competitors run in pairs holding each other round the neck’ W.401 ‘clinging close, maintaining attachment’) **teargas** *noun* kōpani (W.136 ‘an incantation to blind the eyes of a pursuer’)
