Sung in English, with an All-English Cast, comprising Heddie Nash, Robert Easton, Harold Williams, Robert Carr, Miriam Licette, Muriel Brunskill, Doris Vane; with the B.B.C. Choir and Symphony Orchestra,

conducted by Sir Thomas Beecham. When "Faust" was first performed in 1859, it was declared by critics to be far in advance of Gounod's earlier work, and one critic who was bold enough to doubt Gounod's ability to compose it was challenged to a duel. Half a century later the subject was revived, and certain old people who had known the composer circulated a story of his having stolen the score from a young genius who died in a lunatic asylum. The question was discussed in the Paris press a few years ago. Most people, however, accept without query the fact that Gounod himself wrote the opera.
