Jean Baptiste Lully was for thirty years in the service of Louis XIV., first as violinist and ballet dancer, and finally in supreme charge of the music and Court entertainments. His continued success is partly due to the fact that he was able to follow the varying tastes of the king and his court. Thus when Louis, under the influence of Madame de Maintenon, began to grow more devout, Lully turned his attention to sacred music, and produced twenty-three motets.

This "Symphony" describes the dreams of an artist who has tried to poison himself with opium. The work is built on a motto theme which pursues the dreamer everywhere. The first movement describes all the bewildering tumult of heart of one who has fallen madly in love. The second suggests a ball where he meets his beloved, and the third describes a summer evening in the country. In the fourth, he dreams that he has murdered his beloved, and is being marched to the scaffold. The final movement is a very orgy of terror—Witches' Sabbath.

There is no need for him to raise his voice. Only, as he is speaking of things that move him deeply, he is not always able to conceal his suppressed passion, and his climaxes are peaks of intensity rather than of excitement.
