The motive theme which influences the
major portion of this Symphony is said to
be based on a Polish folk-tune. This tune
is the chief subject of the sombre Introduction that leads to the swinging first
movement. It is noisily declaimed and
abruptly sounded at the climax of the
romantic second movement. Near the end
of the waitz which forms the third movement it enters, low down, with a suggestion of mockery, and as the spirited fourth
movement works to a climax it is thundered out triumphantly in the major key.
