He soon became an accomplished violinist and viola soloist and a composer of marked originality. His studies were, for the most part, at Hoch's Conservatorium, Frankfurt; and, when twenty years old, he was appointed leader of the Frankfurt Opera House Orchestra, later becoming chief conductor. In the last few years he has composed much music with an amazing facility.
