 deals with the exploits of a famous bandit,
 which gives the opera its name, and the
 comic element is largely in the hands of a
 travelling English nobleman and his lady.
 The Overture by itself can make clear to
 listeners how much they lose in not being
 able to hear the whole work, and, indeed,
 many others of the school to which it
 belongs.
