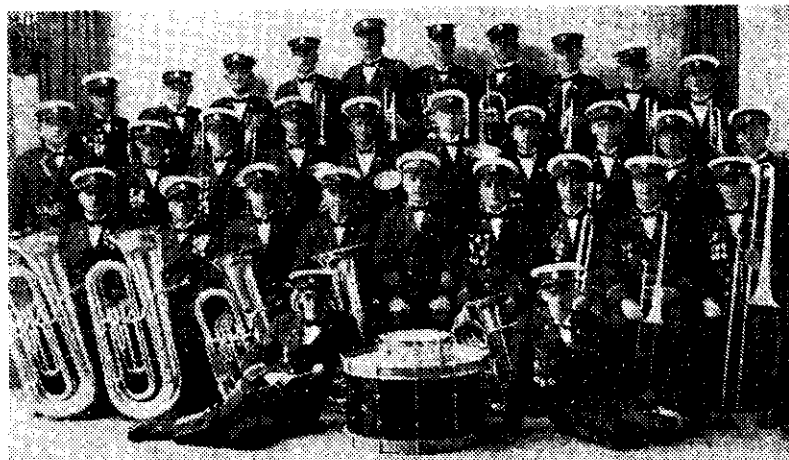

Although Emil Sjogren was an ardent Scandinavian, his music is not so obviously of the Northland as Grieg's. Like his older fellow countryman, he studied a good deal in Germany and toured as a performer in more than one country of Europe. He is best known by three fine Sonatas for violin and pianoforte, but he also wrote a great many smaller pieces with the same finely lyrical qualities as are found in Grieg's work, and many melodious songs.
