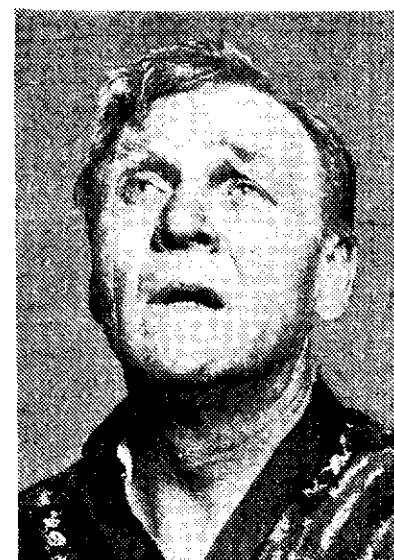

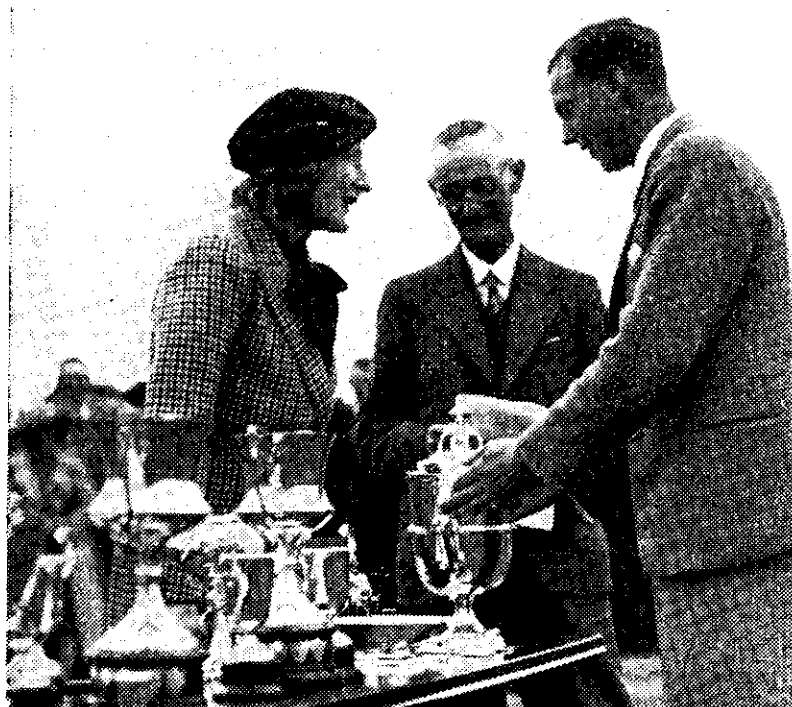
FEODOR CHALIAPIN appears intent on portraying the Russian characteristic of melancholy in this unusual study. The great bass will be heard from 4YA on December 3
