Born at St. Helens in 1906, Horace Finch went to Blackpool for health reasons when thirteen years of age, and has remained there ever since. When fourteen he became pianist in a picture house, and after some changes, joined the staff of the Tower Ballroom as pianist, in 1926. When an organ, identical in specification to Reginald Dixon's famous instrument in the Tower Ballroom, was installed in the Empress Ballroom, Horace Finch was chosen as organist, from among many applicants. He was a church organist in St. Helens when he was only nine years old.
