**RADIO LICENCES**

A slight decrease in the number of radio licences in New Zealand is shown in the latest return from the Post and Telegraph Department, for October 31, 1939.

The provincial figures follow, with the previous months' in parentheses:

Auckland, 97,848 (106,952); Canterbury, 58,810 (61,633); Otago, 44,441 (45,255); Wellington, 108,665 (118,459).

The grand total, including dealers', free, and other special licences, is now 311,927, compared with 334,541 on September 30, and 291,073 on October 31 last year.

Last year, on September 30, the grand total was 307,486, indicating a similar fluctuation annually at this period.
